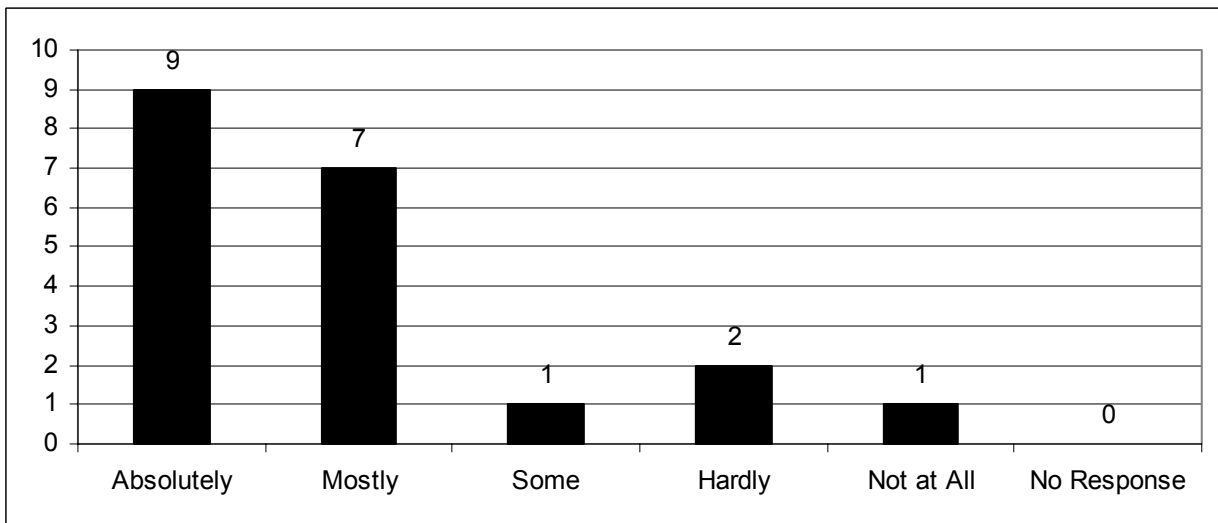

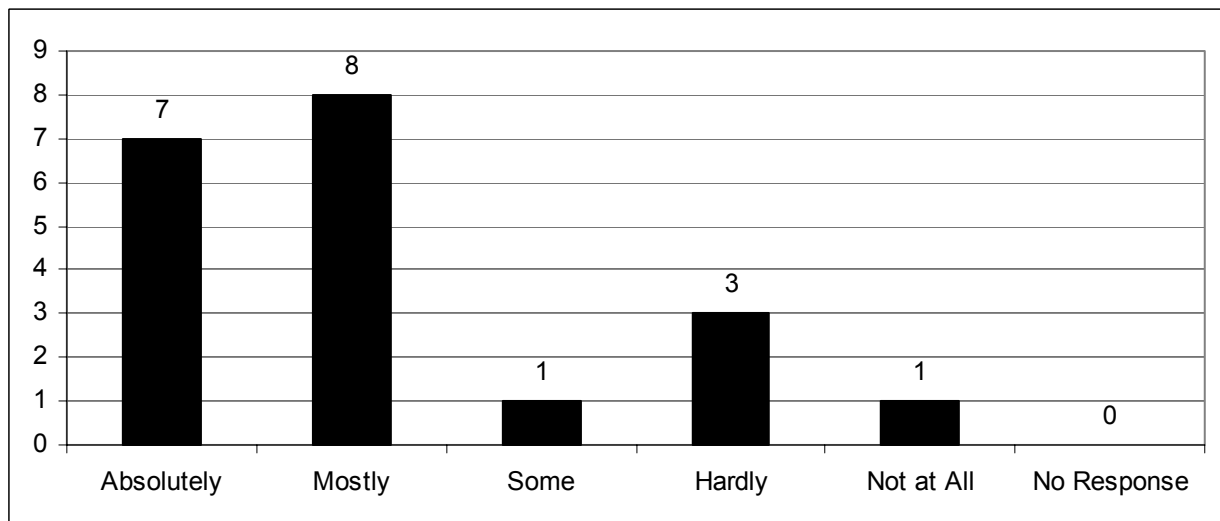
Training Objectives:

Participants will:

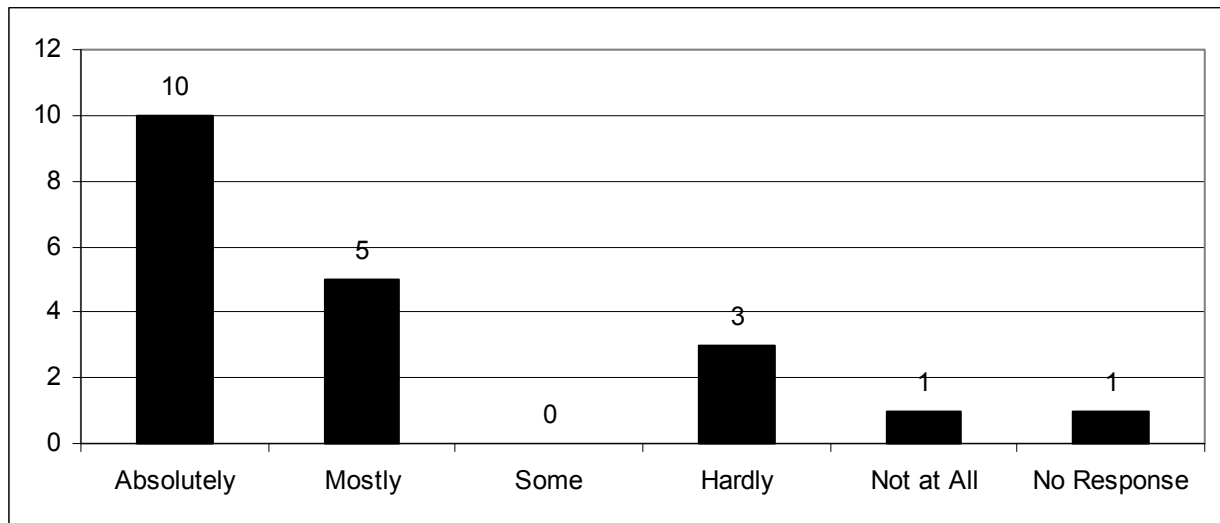
1. Understand that PSR is clinical – dealing with mental illness and behaviors



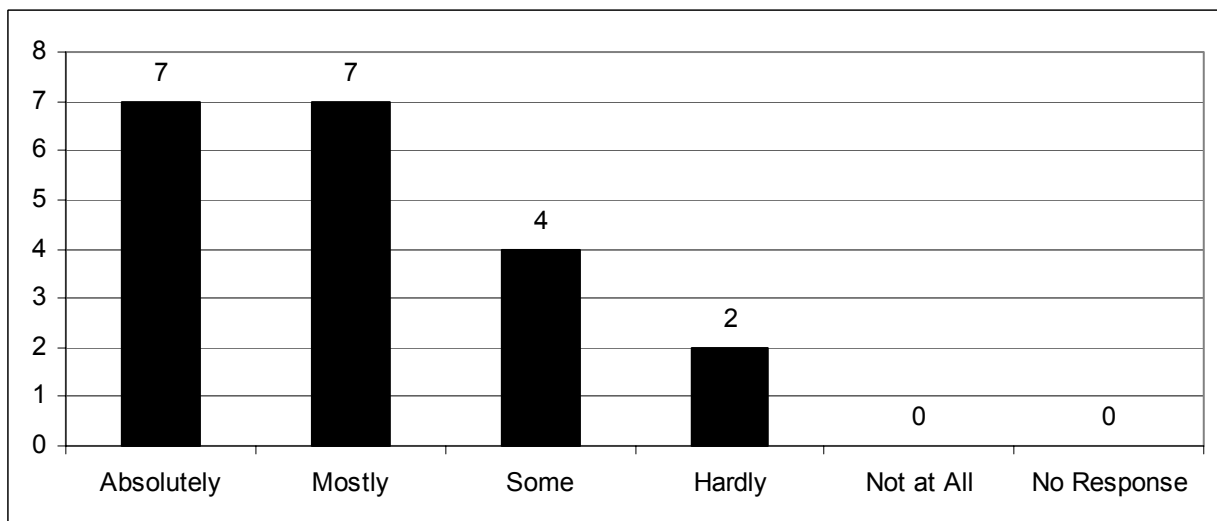
2. Seek 2nd order change – not 1st order



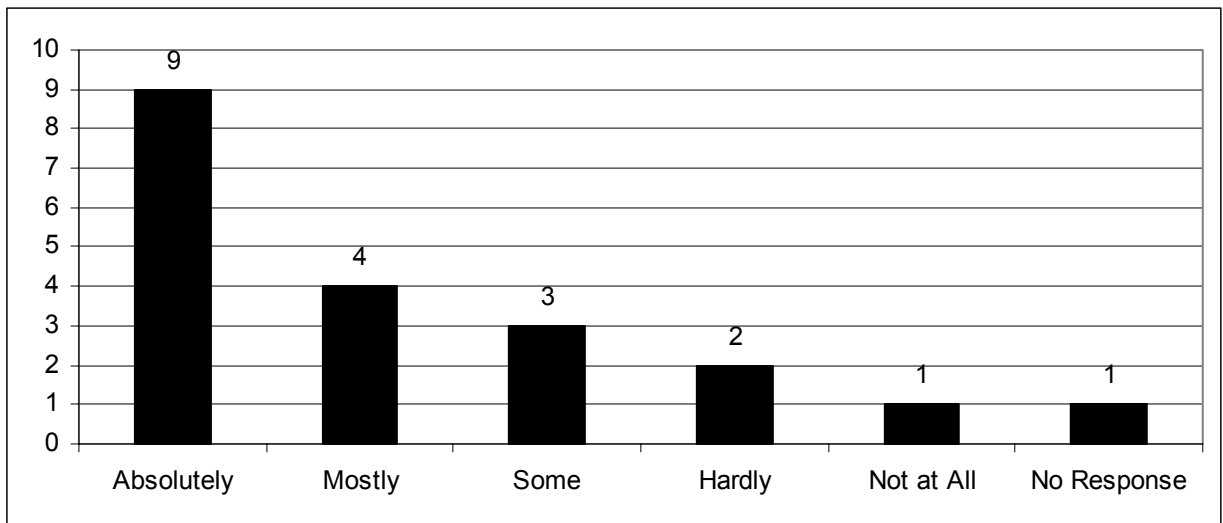
3. Understand that parents and children must be involved for 2nd order change.



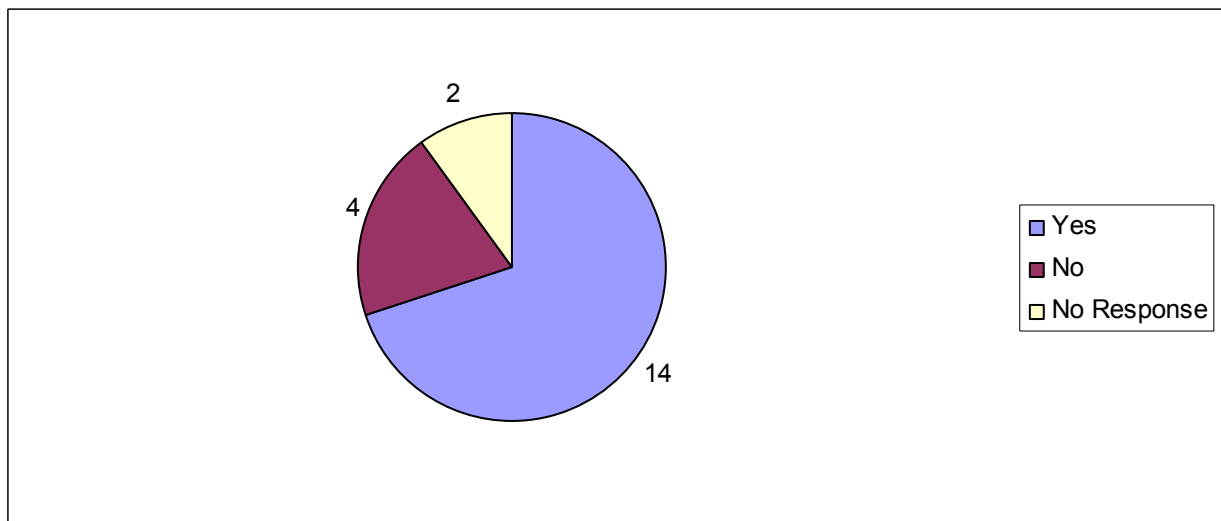
4. Maximize PSR involvement in services – same as IOP (Intensive Outpatient Program)



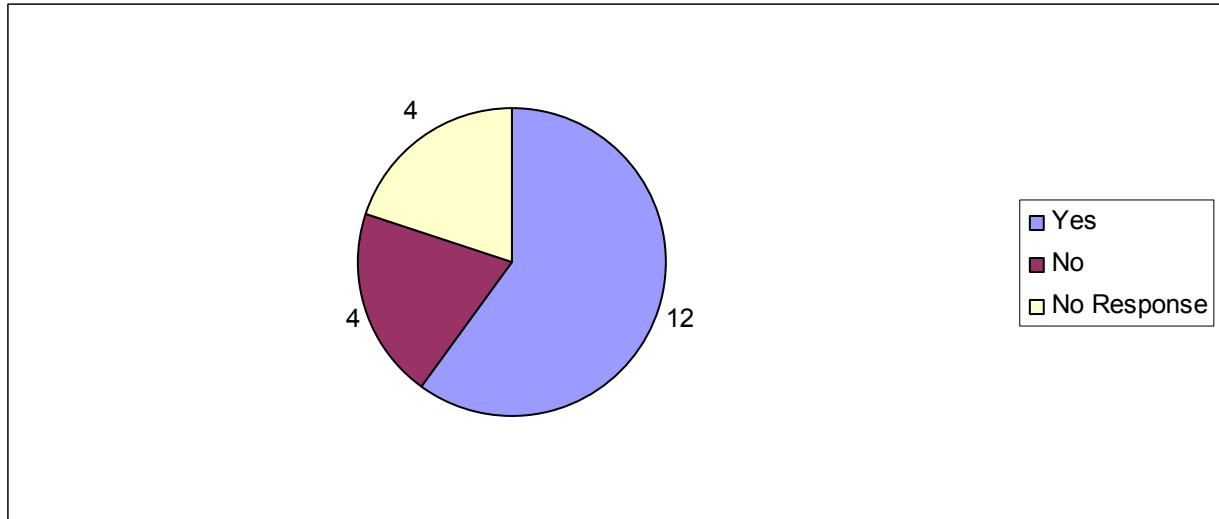
5. Understand that individual work alone is not sufficient to produce change.
