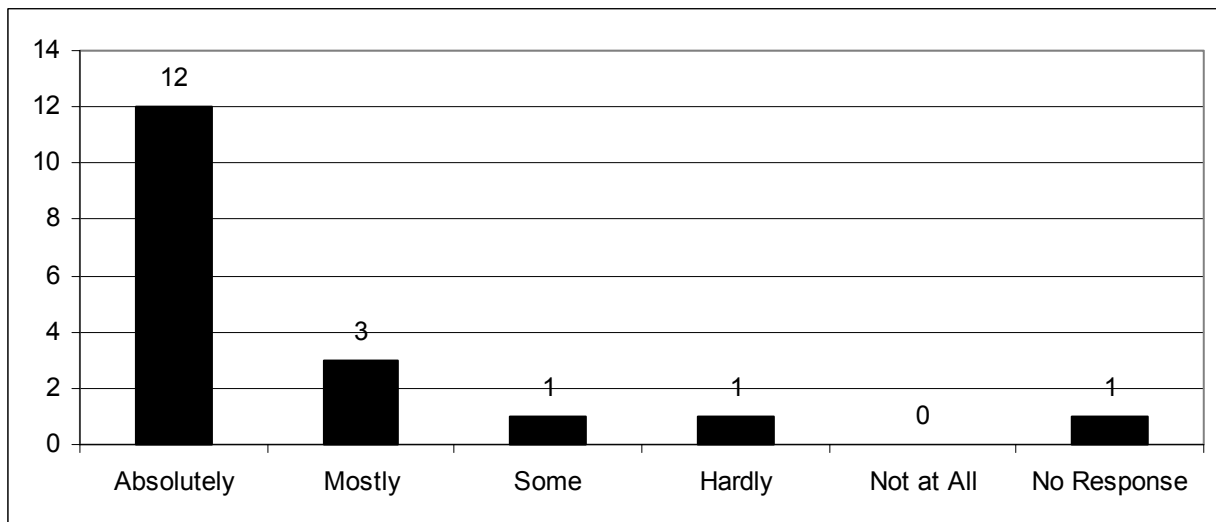

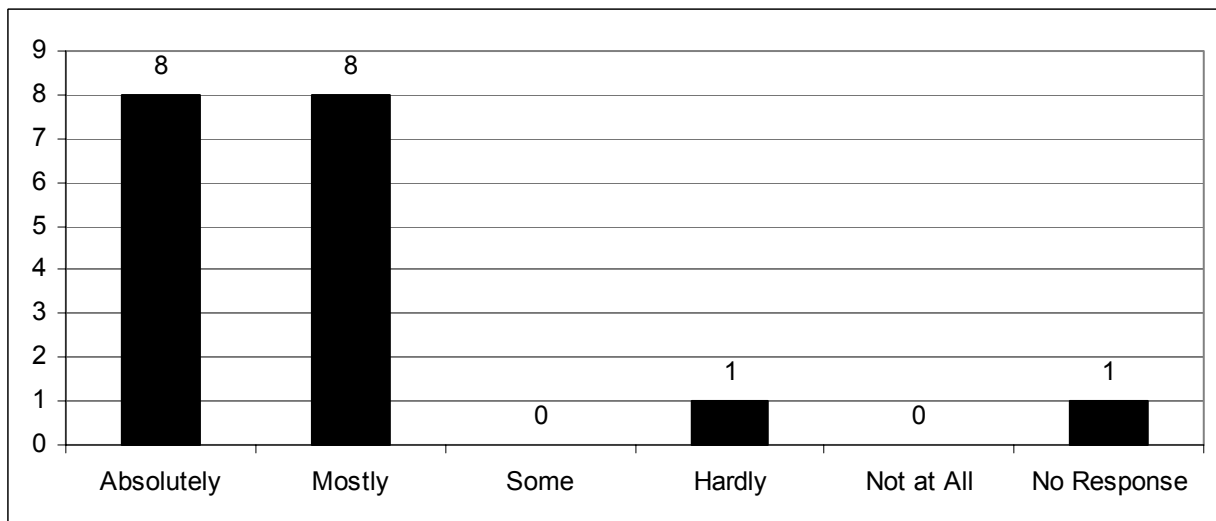

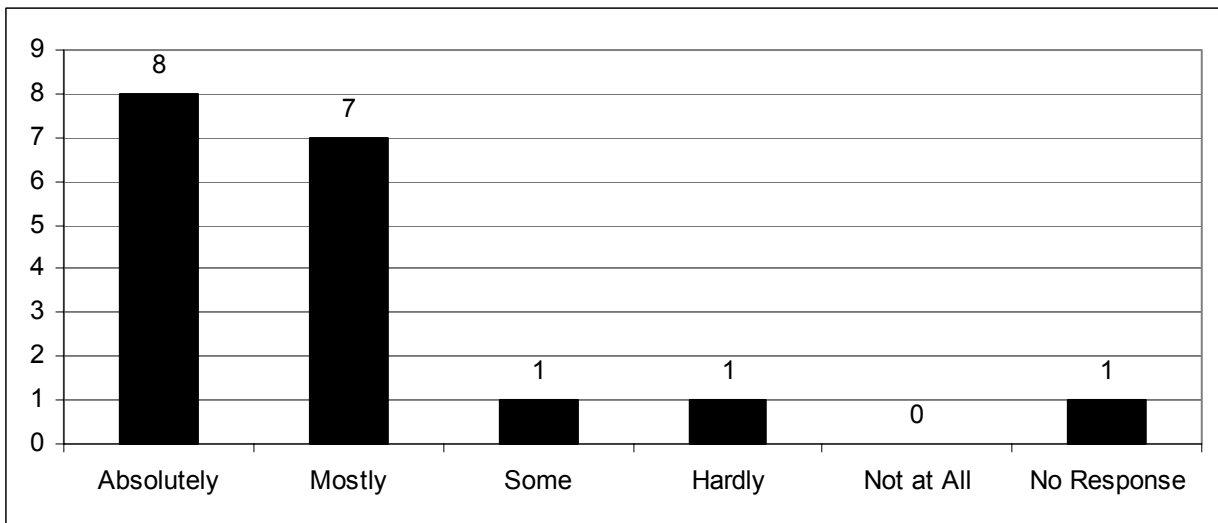
1. To be able to identify the 10 basic elements of wraparound service delivery.



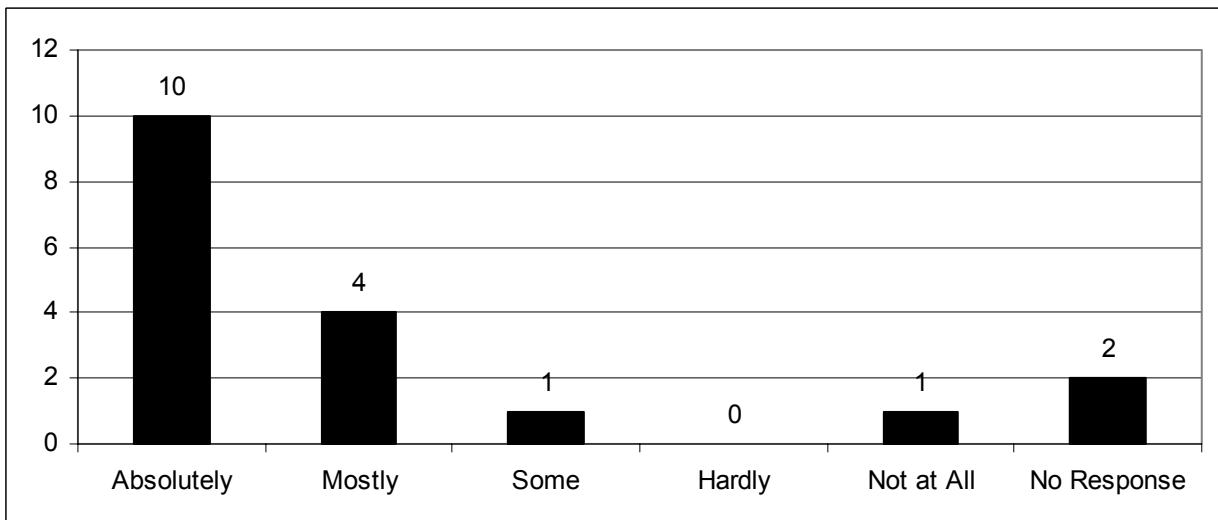
2. To gain an understanding of strength-based approaches to intervention and how to apply them.



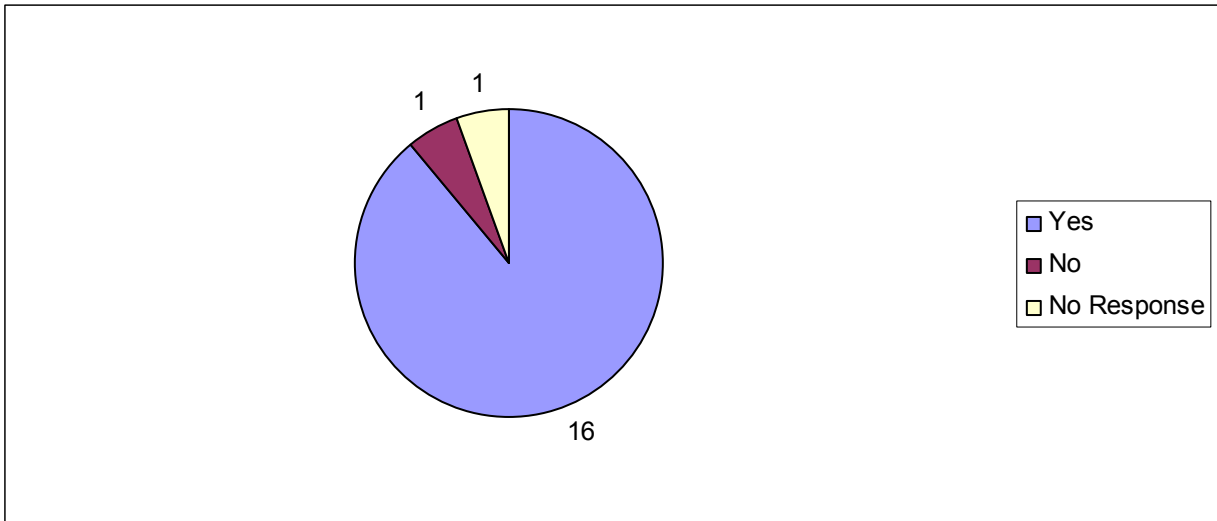
3. To discover the role of unconditional care in working with troubled children and youth.



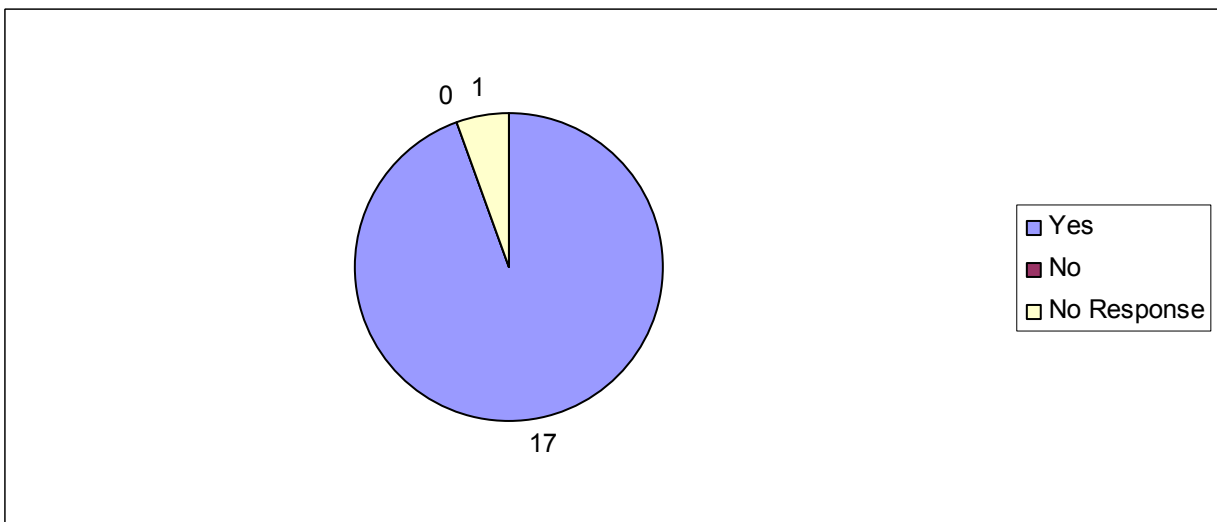
4. To learn how local system of care development is essential in successful wraparound.
